Purpose	To rehearse the language and cultural expectations of meeting people and introducing self in
of lesson	the target language. This will be clearly articulated as a learning goal.
Strategy(ies)	Core strategies
	Students will:
	• view a video clip or listen to a dialogue of people introducing themselves in the target language.
	<ul> <li>identify and write down key words and structures e.g. fill in the blanks in a dialogue script or complete a table.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>brainstorm extra vocabulary (nouns, adjectives, verbs) that could be used in self introductions e.g. via Post-it notes or iPad sticky notes in various colours for nouns, adjectives.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>write the script for a self-introduction.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>write a role-play on meeting new friends and exchanging information (small groups or pairs) then present to the class.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>view a YouTube video of common gestures and culturally-based body language e.g.</li> </ul>
	shrugging shoulders, finger on cheek, hands on hips, facial movements etc. and interpret meaning in class (group discussion).

Resources	<ul> <li>Differentiation strategies</li> <li>Process         <ul> <li>mind-mapping key ideas/structures/vocabulary in small groups.</li> <li>scaffold possibilities for writing a self-introduction, e.g. guided questions, speech bubbles, sentences to complete.</li> <li>reconstruct sentences using, for example, paper cut-up sentence elements, sentence card games, IWB interactive exercises.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Product         <ul> <li>make a short video of their self-introduction and/or role play.</li> <li>create a speaking avatar to introduce themselves and send the link to someone else in class, at another school or overseas.</li> <li>create, conduct and complete a "Get to know you" survey. It can be conducted in class with basic questions in the target language on name, age, nationality, family, sport, likes and dislikes.
