

## How to use this workbook



Engage with your child's learning at home using iPad and free resources. Before you get started, download these apps and the <u>Everyone Can Create</u> guide onto your iPad.




Use the Sketches School app to write your name using different types of pens, pencils and brushes. Try using a different colour for each letter of your name.

What do you notice about your letters, are they thick or thin? Fuzzy or sharp? Which one do you like the best?




When you have completed your name, save your image in the camera roll, and add it to this journal **on the next page.** 






We are going to use Pages to practice drawing patterns. Remember that patterns are designs that repeat. Like this:

Take a look around you. Can you see lots of lines? What about a pattern? You might have a pattern of photos on a wall or may be your floor is a pattern.


Use Pages to draw three different patterns. To draw your pattern, tap the 🕂 then 🐼 then 🏑 . Remember to tap 'done' when you are finished!



### Draw a Story


In this activity you are going to draw a picture that tells a story in Sketches School. Swipe through the instructions below to learn how.

Open the Camera App on the iPad and swipe up until you see Slo-Mo.


#### Here are some ideas you might like to record:


- A toy car making a jump on a ramp.




