Message from Chief Information Officer: Preparing Schools for Digital Age

In the Information Technology Directorate (ITD), our aim is to create a technology environment within the Department that will help prepare our students for life in the digital age.

We strive to provide our students with access to the best educational technology available and our teachers need a strong, reliable set of ICT tools and online resources that can empower their teaching practices.

The Department's ICT environment has been ranked as the largest and most comprehensive in Australia, with more than 500,000 computing devices in 2,500 schools, colleges and corporate worksites across the state.

My role as the Chief Information Officer is to lead ITD in delivering and maintaining this environment, the wide area network and internet services that all department staff and students rely on and the administrative, corporate and learning systems used across the Department.

Under our flagship program, *Technology for Learning* (T4L), ITD delivers thousands of new computers and other equipment to schools each year. In partnership with the regional IT teams, we've also commenced work on a set of T4L projects that are providing schools with a stronger, more flexible and responsive technology foundation that they can adapt and build on.

In 2012, more than 1000 primary schools were migrated to the new Enhanced T4L (eT4L) server and services environment. More than 1000 schools also had their local area networks (LAN) assessed and remediated where required, for better connectivity across learning spaces.

Last month, we were joined in this effort by Dianne Marshall, Program Director from the ground-breaking Digital Education Revolution (DER) program in NSW, which has now provided wirelessly enabled, next generation laptops to all students in years 9 to 12.

Dianne is our new Program Director, T4L and DER,

combining oversight of the final pieces of work under the laptop rollout with leadership of the T4L program. She will provide strategic guidance for eT4L as we finalise the primary school rollout and commence implementation into secondary schools and corporate sites. Dianne and her team's knowledge and experience will be an invaluable asset for us as we begin developing training and support for eT4L.

Welcome Dianne, and welcome to the new *Technology News for Schools* bulletin.

eT4L UPDATE

What is eT4L?

ITD has been working with primary schools to transition to a new managed Windows 7 environment with a range of automated and self service tools.

eT4L offers improved security and privacy provisions as well as personal and shared file storage for staff and students.

By creating a platform for standardised and managed technology, eT4L allows teachers to focus on using tools to deliver better educational outcomes.

For the estimated 1000 primary schools that have migrated to eT4L server and services, it gives them the necessary platform to easily manage their own ICT environment and create a collaborative learning community.

The Department has begun considering the next phase of IT infrastructure in secondary schools. In 2009/10 we saw over \$70m of network infrastructure and wireless technology rolled out to schools with year 9 to 12 enrolments as part of DER.



During 2013 it is expected that work will start on refreshing the DER servers (DIP) in schools.

Requirements in secondary schools will differ from those in the primary sector. The first stage of this project will be consultation with stakeholders to better understand the needs of secondary schools and ensure existing

DER and school infrastructure can work seamlessly together.

DEVICES UPDATE

T4L Rollout

The 2012/13 T4L computer equipment rollout is on schedule with deliveries and installations continuing to take place in March for Phase 2 schools.

More than half of the 63,500 devices have been rolled out to schools. The Technology Support Officer (TSO) team across the state is busily commissioning the laptops for students.

Research work is progressing in the evaluation of Windows 8 installed tablets. Currently, a number of tablets are being trialled with a networked image.

Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Update

The draft DEC BYOD Policy is now in consultation phase. The Secondary Principals' Council (SPC) and the Primary Principals' Association (PPA) are currently reviewing the document.

Accompanying the policy will be school and parent guidelines, support and training materials for schools.

SAM Initiative

This month, every School Administrative Manager (SAM) will receive a new desktop computer and 22 inch monitor to assist with the transition to the Learning Management and Business Reform (LMBR) program.

SERVICE DESK UPDATE

Currently, ITD is reviewing the way ICT support is offered to schools and corporate/regional offices. The aim of the project is to develop an improved and standardised ICT support model.

A project team has been established and will begin to engage with a number of stakeholders, including the SPC, PPA, and regions.

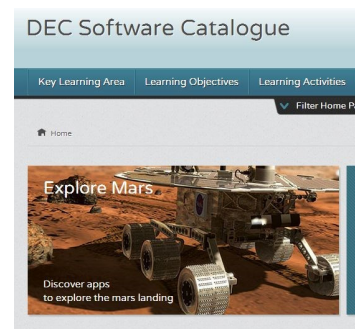
Sample schools have been nominated by regional IT managers and include a cross-section of schools currently being supported by regional teams and those using their own external ICT support staff.

ONLINE SERVICES UPDATE

Software Catalogue - As part of the eT4L solution, NSW primary schools will soon be able to access an online software catalogue. The catalogue will contain relevant software aimed at maximising learning outcomes.

The DEC Software Catalogue will be made available via a link in the DEC staff portal. It will provide authorised personnel with a quicker and easier process for installing the latest Enterprise Agreement and site licensed software versions to one or many devices.



The online catalogue will give teachers access to thousands of approved applications in a centralised domain. It will also ensure that schools will have access to the best possible software for their needs via a user friendly interface.

The website database and processes are being finalised. Phase 1 of the catalogue will be trialled in the first half of this year.

Library - Currently, a Request for Tender (RFT) for the new library management solution is being finalised.

The RFT is seeking a school library solution to replace the OASIS library component and to also provide schools with additional functionality, such as the capacity to integrate with eBook vendors.

The project will involve migrating existing data from the OASIS library to the new solution.

BlogED - BlogED continues to provide a safe, reliable and simple blogging solution for staff and students.

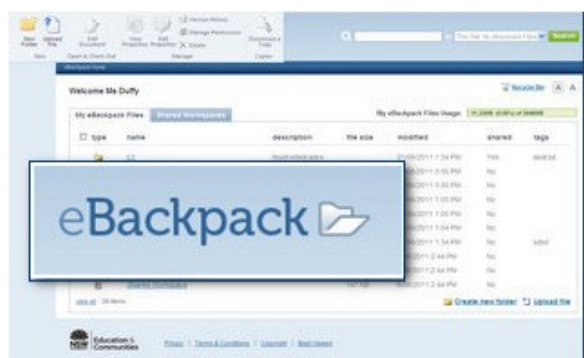
An audit at the end of last year revealed 500,000 comments on 14,000 BlogED sites were created during the academic year. So far this year, more than 1,100 sites have been created and used by an estimated 2,000 users.

eBackpack - eBackpack is a convenient tool that is available to all schools. Leveraging the Microsoft platform, eBackpack empowers students and teachers to work in collaborative spaces. Since its full release in 2012, approximately 100 schools a month have been provisioned with the platform.

Using a web browser, eBackpack users can upload, view and edit documents from anywhere. Teachers can create shared workspaces or sites in which they can display class announcements, share files, list important web links and display student work.



eBackpack also brings Live OneNote sharing back to the classroom and integrates seamlessly with the DER-NSW

Adobe Connect - This interactive webinar platform supports web conferencing, online meetings and virtual learning. More than 2,000 staff have completed training in use of the platform. Google Apps - The rollout of Google Apps for Education in DEC is in the last stages of preparation. We anticipate availability to all students and staff in Term 1. The final technical details are being configured to ensure an easy and simple interface for all users.



Major features include access via the portal and professional learning resources to support teachers in this environment.
